


Life is an Open Book

BOOKS FOR AFRICA 2012 ANNUAL REPORT









Dear Friends,

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you, our donors and supporters of Books For Africa, for another outstanding year. Thank you everyone for your help in sending more books to people who want to learn and improve their lives! We want to share with you some of what we have been able to achieve in 2012:

- We shipped A LOT of books: In 2012, we shipped 2.2 million books, 616 computers, and 15 new law libraries valued at over \$28 million to 22 African countries. BFA retained its position as the world's largest shipper of donated text and library books to the African continent having shipped over 27 million books to 48 African countries, and Charity Navigator gave us its top rating for the sixth consecutive year;
- We walked the walk: In February, BFA Founder Tom Warth led a delegation that walked across The Gambia
 to deliver books to students benefitting from our drive to send one million books to the West African country;
- Our voice was heard: In April, BFA Executive Director Pat Plonski was asked to serve as a keynote speaker
 for the World Literacy Summit in Oxford, England, to talk about how donated books are making a difference
 in schools across the African continent;
- We journeyed to new places: Also in April, BFA books arrived in Africa's newest country, South Sudan;
- We welcomed distinguished guests: In May, BFA welcomed the Kenyan Ambassador to the U.S.,
 His Excellency Elkanah Odembo, who shared his own experience with the power of books and education
 as the keynote speaker for our annual fundraiser in St. Paul, Minnesota;
- We hosted big names: In October, BFA celebrated its third year of operation in Atlanta, Georgia, with a Voices For Literacy Day event featuring NBA legend Dikembe Mutombo as keynote speaker;
- We saw the good we are doing: In October, BFA participated in a key book distribution ceremony
 in Nigeria with our partner, the Sir Emeka Offor Foundation;

It has truly been a great year, with so much achieved for the children of Africa. In 2012 we raised more money and shipped more books than ever before in our history. Thank you to all of you, our faithful donors, for your support which has allowed these successes to be achieved. We welcome your continuing financial support as we persist in our efforts to end the book famine in Africa.

How To Help Support Books For Africa

50¢ cents provides a student in Africa with a book

\$100 provides a classroom set of books

\$200 provides an encyclopedia set for a school or community library

\$2,000 provides enough books for an entire school

\$10,300 supplies a full 40-foot sea container of 22,000 books – enough for 10 schools



Cash Gifts

Your cash, check or credit card gift to Books For Africa can be designated for a specific program or directed to where the need is greatest. All gifts are tax deductible, as specified by law. For your convenience, gifts by credit card can be made directly online at ww.booksforafrica.org.

Matching Gifts

Many companies match employee donations dollar for dollar to the charity of the employee's choice. Check with your employer about matching your gifts to Books For Africa.

Wills and Other Planned Gifts

Books For Africa can be named a beneficiary in your will and receive other deferred gifts such as life insurance. These gifts are not subject to estate taxes.

Gifts of Appreciated Stock

Books For Africa and you can benefit from gifts of stock (provided you have held the stock for 18 months or longer). You can eliminate capital gains taxes, avoid income tax on the gifted stock, and receive tax deductions for the full value of the stock.
