BFA is pleased to partner with the Sir Emeka Offor Foundation (SEOF) in signing a \$400,000 Memorandum of Understanding to ship 32 containers of books to Nigeria. The Foundation is a Nigerian non-governmental

organization with the mission to help raise Nigerians from poverty. SEOF largely focuses on providing quality education and educational materials to Nigerian students of all ages.

The group was founded by Sir Emeka Offor, a well known Nigerian businessman. It is the philanthropic branch of the Chrome Group, a grouping of organizations involved in the Nigerian oil industry. Dr. Patrick Plonski and BFA Board Member Mike Essien visited Sir Emeka Offor last fall to formally sign the agreement. "Books are the foundation of a strong educational system and I am proud to accomplish this in collaboration with the philanthropic efforts of Books For Africa. I wholeheartedly endorse the mutual goal of helping to improve the book situation in African schools," said Sir Emeka Offor.
