BOOKS FOR AFRICA 2025 ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Friend,

2025 has been another groundbreaking year for Books For Africa, and it's all thanks to your incredible support. Together, we've made tremendous strides in addressing the African book famine. Here's a glimpse of what we've achieved together.

Breaking Records: Millions of Books Delivered

Books For Africa continues to lead the way as the world's largest shipper of donated books to Africa, having delivered over 64 million books to date. Over the past 37 years, we've reached every single one of Africa's 55 countries. This year, we shipped over 2.8 million books, valued at over \$28.5 million, to 36 African countries. In addition, over a half million digital books were sent on 163 computers and tablets. With the support of generous donors, we raised over \$2.5 million to ensure these books reached their destinations across Africa. Over 9,000 volunteers helped to pack these books for shipment to Africa.

Recognized for Excellence

We are honored to have received Charity Navigator's highest 4-star rating for the 18th consecutive year, placing us in the top 2% of U.S. nonprofits for accountability and transparency. We also earned the 2025 GuideStar Platinum Seal of Transparency, further demonstrating the trust you place in our work.

Building Partnerships with Inspiring Leaders

2025 was filled with meaningful partnerships and memorable events. Highlights include:

- An April presentation at the World Literacy Summit in Oxford, followed by visits with partners in Qatar and Ethiopia.
- Our annual fundraiser in St. Paul in May, with a keynote by Kenya's Ambassador to the U.S., H.E. Ambassador David Kerich.
- Our June Summit Society event in Washington, D.C., hosted at the Zambian Embassy by H.E. Ambassador Chibamba Kanyama, with diplomatic representation from eight African countries.
- A September fundraising reception in Atlanta with H.E. Mohamed Siad Doualeh, Djibouti's Ambassador to the U.S., as keynote speaker.
- A September fundraiser and climb of Barn Bluff in Red Wing, Minnesota, led by our Founder, Tom Warth.
- October site visits to book locations in Uganda and Rwanda by BFA board members, including President Tammie Follett and Erin Bagniewski and site visits to Kenya by BFA board member Lillian Otieno.
- A November visit to the African Union Headquarters in Washington, D.C., to plan strategies for getting more books to African countries.

Approximately 9,000 volunteers from organizations like Delta, Home Depot, UPS, Voya, and more helped sort millions of books for shipment to Africa.

Expanding Our Global Reach

Books were shipped this year from locations across the globe, including Atlanta, London, Montreal, San Francisco, Annapolis, Dubai, New York, and beyond. Our incredible partners—such as Better World Books, Thomson Reuters, the American Bar Association, Lerner Publishing, Scholastic, Capstone Publishing, Elsevier, Walker Bookstore, Superior Text, and Merck—have been instrumental in ensuring

African learners receive the high-quality, relevant materials they need. We are also deeply grateful to the thousands of individuals, schools, universities, and libraries that donated books this year.

Visibility

Our work has also been featured in media outlets like Global Atlanta, KSTP-TV, WCSC-TV, the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution*, *Publishers Weekly*, the *National Peace Corps Association Magazine*, *Rotary Magazine*, *Mshale*, and others, showcasing the powerful impact of our efforts.

Listening and Learning from Our Partners

We are committed to learning from our recipients. This year, we received feedback from 28 partners across 17 countries, reinforcing how BFA books are transforming communities. Their stories confirm that our materials are not only of high quality, but also essential in addressing the literacy needs of their regions. We also welcomed 30 Mandela Fellows from 24 African countries to our Atlanta warehouse for Mandela Day (and a similar number for an event at our Minnesota warehouse), where we gathered insights into literacy challenges in their countries.

Together, Bridging the Literacy Gap

In 2025, we've worked hand in hand with partners around the world to deliver millions of books in both print and digital formats. For 37 years, we've been driven by the dream of the late Kofi Annan, who said, "Literacy is quite simply the bridge from misery to hope." Because of you, millions of children across Africa now have the tools they need to learn, grow, and thrive.

Thank you for your unwavering support. Together, we are changing lives—one book at a time.






BOOKS E-READERS AND SOLAR LAMPS DONATION REPORT

This subject matter refers; Kindly receive the above stated report from Phronesis International College.

Phronesis International College (PIC) Library is delighted to share this report on the generous donation received from Books for Africa. The donation includes twenty (20) pallets of books (approximately 20,000 books), five (5) e-readers, and three hundred and six (306) solar lamps. This report provides an overview of the donation, how it has been received and used and their impact on our students and the community. It also highlights plans for future use, showing how these resources will continue to support learning and literacy.

2. OVERVIEW OF THE DONATION

The items received from Books for Africa include:
•Books: 20 pallets of books across different subjects and reading levels.
•E-readers: Five (5) Black view tablets, each with a charger and preloaded educational content.
•Solar Lamps: 306 portable solar-powered lamps to support reading and studying where electricity is limited.

3. BOOKS DONATION

3.1 Receipt and Storage
The books were safely received and are currently stored in the library. Because of the large amount, the library moved to a larger space to accommodate the collection. While the books are being catalogued, classified and shelved, they are already ready to enrich learning once processed.

3.2 Educational Benefits
The books cover different subjects and reading levels, from beginner to advanced. This variety means that every learner, regardless of age or ability, can find something valuable. These books help students gain knowledge across multiple subjects.





BOOKS FOR AFRICA SHIPS COUNSELING AND MENTAL HEALTH BOOKS TO NEW COLLEGE IN BOTSWANA

In 2024, Books For Africa was contacted by an American associate of a new college in Botswana, seeking computers for the academic community. When a grant opportunity arose that would help sponsor not just computers but a full container of books, the college was quick to seize the opportunity.

Phronesis College is a new college focusing on counseling, trauma, child development, and mental and behavioral health. U.S.-based friends of the college conducted a book drive to ensure a high proportion of books focusing on the core areas of study, and these were packed along with a number of e-readers pre-loaded with Merck Medical Manuals, funded by Merck & Co.

The shipment also received support from BetterWorld Trust, and solar lights from Solar Buddy. Phronesis students shared in a video message that they are “excited, honored and pleased” with the new resources, which will build out this new institution’s library and contribute to behavioral health studies in Southern Africa.

PARTNERSHIP WITH FOUNDATION OF NIGERIAN AND GHANAIAN SISTERS SHIPS ANOTHER CONTAINER OF BOOKS TO GUINEA


Child2Child Book Foundation was founded in 2019 by two sets of sisters originally from Ghana and Nigeria. They have worked with Books For Africa to deliver books to multiple countries already, including Nigeria, Ghana and Togo. In 2025, in partnership with journalist Folly Bah Thibault, they added Guinea to their list of countries served.

The shipment of French-language books out of our France partner warehouse was delivered to the Elle ira à l'école program, supported by the Kesso Bah Foundation, and distributed to 25 schools in six districts. Distribution events were attended by the Guinea Minister of Education and the Minister of Digital Infrastructure.

Child2Child Trustee Nana Appiah-Korang reported that many students received their very first storybooks, and that the shipment reinforced the importance of education for both girls and boys.

PARTNERSHIPS SUPPLY IN-DEMAND MEDICAL BOOKS

Books For Africa is committed to developing partnerships that expand access to high-quality professional resources for the health care students and workers of the African continent. Its partnerships with Merck & Co. and with Elsevier are two such examples, providing funding and books for the next generation of medical professionals.

In 2025, Books For Africa's Tunisian partners indicated a need for high-level medical books at the Monastir Faculty of Pharmacy, and Books For Africa was fortunate to have a large stock of brand-new medical books from partner and well-known STEM publisher, Elsevier. These books will build out the institution's library and resources, while a law and human rights library, supplied by a partnership with Thomson Reuters and the ABA, went to build out the Tunisian Diplomatic Academy.

The shipment also received support from BetterWorld Trust, and import assistance from the Tunisian Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research.





Books For Africa has shipped over 64 million books and over 8 million digital books, serving all 55 African countries in the past 37 years.

Millions more are needed.

In fiscal year 2025, Books For Africa shipped over 2.8 million books, valued at over \$28.5 million, to 36 countries—a 78% increase over the previous year. Over half a million digital books were also shipped on 163 computers and e-readers. Approximately \$2.5 million was raised to ship these books to partners across Africa. Over 9,000 volunteers joined BFA staff in helping to pack these books for shipment to Africa.
