10 Millionth Book Celebrated at Special Event

Books For Africa celebrated the shipment of its 10 millionth book to Africa since its creation in 1988 with a special tent party outside its St. Paul, Minnesota warehouse. The October 2nd event -- featuring food, music, and a special program -- was free and open to the public, and took place in front of BFA's St. Paul, Minnesota warehouse. Speakers included BFA founder Tom Warth; U.S. Member of Congress Betty McCollum; and Better World Books representatives Xavier Helgsen, Jeff Kurtzman, and Dave Murphy. BWB presented Books For Africa with a pledge of \$121,225. Congratulatory letters to Books For Africa from various dignitaries across the world were also read. Governor Tim Pawlenty declared October 2nd "Books For Africa Day in Minnesota" and the St. Paul City Council declared it "Books For Africa Day" in Minnesota's capitol city.

"This is a great opportunity to celebrate with the community the tremendous achievement of Books For Africa shipping 10 million books to the African continent over the course of 16 years," said Books For Africa founder Tom Warth.

Since its establishment in 1988, Books For Africa has grown to become the largest shipper of donated schoolbooks to the African continent. 23 African countries have received book shipments from Books For Africa. Last year approximately 1.4 million books valued at almost 13 million were shipped by Books For Africa.

FY 2004 Another Record-setting Year at BFA

It was another record-setting year as Books For Africa exceeded its shipping goal for fiscal year 2003 by sending a total of 56 containers of books valued at almost \$13 million. Books For Africa also raised a record \$523,000 in cash to ship these 1.4 million books. The shipment of large quantities of donated schoolbooks to schools, libraries, and universities throughout Africa is the core mission of BFA, and serves as the key measure of the organization's success. Funding from individuals, organizations, and key sponsors allows BFA to pay the costs of book shipments to Africa. Thank you to all BFA donors for helping make this effort possible. Without the large and small donations by BFA donors none of this would be possible!

"This trip was important to tour sites where schoolbooks are being shipped in Africa, and to lay the groundwork to ship many more containers of books in the future," Plonski said.

BFA to Co-host Visit of South African Ambassador

On Tuesday, October 26th from 5:30 - 7:30 p.m. Books For Africa is cosponsoring a reception and presentation with the Minnesota International Center by Her Excellency Barbara Masekela, South Africa's ambassador to the United States. The presentation will take place at the Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs, 301 19th Avenue South, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota (registration \$10 - BFA supporters). Entitled "Reflections on a Decade of Democracy in South Africa", this presentation will touch on events since 1994 when South Africa held its first democratic elections and transformed the country from apartheid to a democracy. A former college professor of English Literature and former President Mandela's chief of staff, Ms. Masekela has served as South Africa's ambassador to the U.S. since 2003. Books For Africa has shipped 41 containers of school books to South Africa since 1988, and is planning to ship an additional five containers in the fall of 2004. Join Books For Africa and the Minnesota International Center in hosting Ambassador Masekela and hearing what promises to be a most informative discussion.

BFA Partners With World Food Programme

Books For Africa kicked off a new partnership with the United Nations on September 22nd by shipping the first of 12 40-foot containers of textbooks to the World Food Programme in Africa. The first shipment left the Books For Africa warehouse in St. Paul, Minnesota on September 22nd bound for Lesotho, Southern Africa as part of the United Against Hunger Campaign. The United Against Hunger Campaign, headed by the World Food Programme, is an effort to draw together many partners from across the United States to address the issue of global hunger.

Over the next 12 months, a total of 12 40-foot sea containers of books will be shipped to schools across Africa in partnership with the World Food Programme School Feeding Program. Over 400,000 books valued at \$2 million will be delivered under this project. USAID is providing financial support for this effort.

"Books For Africa is proud to work in partnership with the



United Nations World Food Programme, and the United States Agency For International Development to pool our resources and simultaneously improve education and nutrition across Africa," said Books For Africa Executive Director Pat Plonski. The World Food Programme is the United Nation's front line in the fight against hunger. In 2003, WFP fed 104 million people in 81 countries, including 15.2 million school students in 69 countries through its global school feeding programs.

Better World Books to Become BFA's Largest Donor

BFA continues to develop its strategic partnership with Better World Books (formerly known as Campus Community Outreach). Better World Books helped celebrate the shipment of BFA's 10 millionth book on October 2, 2004 with a special presentation of a pledge in the amount of \$121,225 for FY 05. Xavier Helgesen, who has recently joined BFA's board of directors, Jeff Kurtzman, and David Murphy from Better World Books were on hand to present the pledge and a \$20,000 check to BFA. This pledge makes Better World Books the largest single donor to BFA for FY 2005. Better World Books has already provided BFA with cash donations totalling \$67,100 as well as book donations.

"This level of support by Better World Books is critical to Books For Africa to enable us to continue our mission of serving the children of Africa," said Books For Africa Executive Director Pat Plonski. "The unrestricted donations and pledges by Better World Books to Books For Africa represent approximately 23% of our annual operating budget. We will have the capacity to ship hundreds of thousands of books to Africa as a direct result of this generous support by Better World Books," Plonski continued.

Better World Books is an organization that utilizes the value of the used book to fund socially responsible literacy initiatives worldwide. Books are collected from schools, individuals, and universities and sold via the internet and other mechanisms with the profits used to benefit Books For Africa.
