Students in South Africa Trade Photocopies for Books

"Xiluva, I teach an after-school reading group, but we only have photocopied pages from text books to use. Do you think you could help me to find some books for the learners?" —Teacher in South Africa

Spurred on by this simple request, Rose Zulliger (AKA "Xiluva") found her way to the Books For Africa website. Zulliger, a Peace Corps Volunteer currently serving in South Africa, went on to organize and help distribute a BFA shipment of 22,000 text and library books to 30 schools and communities throughout South Africa.

To cover shipping costs, each recipient school raised \$200 USD in a variety of creative ways such as hosting carnivals and taking student photos. The remainder of the funds was raised through the Peace Corps Partnership Program.

Zulliger writes: "The books were of the highest quality and exceeded my expectations on every level. I cannot even begin to describe the gratitude and excitement shared by countless volunteers, communities, schools, and children. Thank you!"



On September 12, 2008, over 350 Books For Africa supporters gathered

at the History Center in St. Paul, Minnesota, USA, to celebrate 20 years of service to the children of Africa.

Kerri Miller of Minnesota Public Radio emceed the gala program, which included a videotaped message from Kofi Annan offering his congratulations to Books For Africa and BFA founder Tom Warth. Annan is an honorary co-chair of the Jack Mason Law & Democracy Initiative, which aims to ship law books to Africa.

The Honorable Welile Nhlapo, South African Ambassador to the U.S., voiced his support for Books For Africa's initiatives and described the need for books in his country:

"Make no mistake, there are hundreds and thousands of [South African] people, young and old, who aspire to an education so that they can become their own agents of change and lead themselves out of the trap of poverty that has kept them down for much too long."

Minnesota Congresswoman Betty McCollum and Congressman Keith Ellison voiced their enthusiastic support for BFA, and Agness Swai expressed appreciation—on behalf of Tanzania National Parks and of the children of Africa—for the donation of BFA books that was

distributed in her country last year.

At the special breakfast on Saturday morning hosted by St. Paul Mayor Chris Coleman, the Honorable Ombeni Sefue, Tanzanian Ambassador to the U.S., expressed his appreciation for "the generosity of the American people, for their contribution to the education of the African people."

The weekend festivities concluded with a South African-style braai (barbecue) hosted by wine importer MT Global at the BFA warehouse on Saturday afternoon. Two 40-foot containers of BFA books were given a send-off to Tanzania and South Africa.

Congressman Keith Ellison (MN) Delivers BFA Books to Five African Nations

In late June, Congressman Keith Ellison (MN) traveled to Africa with five other members of Congress as part of his work for the House Democracy

Assistance Commission (HDAC). They met with elected representatives and government officials in Liberia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya,

Malawi, and Mauritania.

In each country visited, Congressman Ellison paused to deliver sets of brand-new encyclopedias, dictionaries, and atlases provided by Books For Africa. He describes his experience Kenya like this:

"In Kenya, we were in a small village and the students had a wonderful school. They were eager to learn. They had motivated teachers, but they didn't have any books in the school. They had no library. And so, imagine how proud I was to open up this box of shiny new encyclopedias and dictionaries from Books For Africa. They want more of your books. They can't wait."

According to Congressman Ellison, "Those gifts reinforced our personally delivered messages of friendship, partnership, and technical assistance as we seek to govern more effectively, and more compassionately, in both the United States and Africa."

Two New Grants Fund 19 Book Shipments to Eight African Countries

\$95,000 Grant from Oprah's Angel Network Will Send 200,000 Books to Africa

Oprah's Angel Network has awarded Books For Africa a generous \$95,000 grant, which will be used to ship nine 40-foot containers of books to school-age children in South Africa, Tanzania, and Liberia who currently have little or no access to reading materials.

"Access to books give children a window into the larger world and helps them think about their own futures," said Caren Yanis, Executive Director of Oprah's Angel Network. "This grant will put books into classrooms and enable students to rise to their full potential."

Oprah's Angel Network is a public charity that uses public donations to award grants to organizations around the world that are improving access to education, developing leaders, protecting basic rights, and creating communities of support.

\$90,000 Grant from the OPEC Fund for International Development

Thanks to a \$90,000 grant from the OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID), Books For Africa is sending over 200,000 text

and library books to five North African countries. According to OFID, "Providing fresh new learning tools for beneficiary schools will have a positive influence on boosting attendance rates and encouraging children to remain in school."

Ten 40-foot containers of books in all will be sent to Chad, Egypt, Mauritania, Morocco, and Tunisia. The books are earmarked for Arabic-speaking students who are eager to learn English and read English textbooks.
