



In the 8 years we've been conducting the recipient feedback surveys, we've increased the percentage of respondents who answered "strongly agree" that books promoted literacy in their community by 21%, and we've increased the percentage who answered "strongly agree" that BFA books make a positive impact on their learning community by 13%! We listen to our recipients' feedback, and the results show we're moving in the right direction!


